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Important information for parents

- Please make a follow-up appointment with your obstetrician in 8-10 weeks
 - o If you asked for an autopsy, preliminary results could be available. Make sure to ask.
 - Final autopsy results may take 6-12 months. If you have no news, call your doctor to ask.
- Funeral arrangements
 - If you want to make your own funeral arrangements for your baby, you need to contact a funeral home. They will take care of communicating with the hospital to pick the baby up.
 - If you have asked for an autopsy, it is usually performed within 2 business days. The funeral home can call the hospital after that.
 - O If you want the hospital to take care of your baby's remains, here is what happens:
 - The funeral home picks the baby up from the hospital and arranges for the baby to be buried in a community section of their cemetery in Laval (Magnus Poirier funeral home)
 - O You have 2 weeks to change your mind about the care of your baby's remains.
 - If you change your mind, call 514-934-1934 extension 34778 (if absent extension 36677)
- Baby pictures and memory box
 - You can have the memory box before you leave the hospital
 - For your baby's pictures call 514-934-1934 extension 34778. You can get them by email or on a DVD, starting one week after your delivery.
 - If you don't want the pictures or the memory box, we keep them for you in case you change your mind. If you decide that you want them, call the above number.
