Overcapacity Plan (adult sites) Executive Summary for Transport Teams

This plan aims to provide a clear and cohesive strategy for managing overcapacity situations, ensuring that critical services, the **ED**, **OR** and **ICU** can fulfil their mandates. The inclusion of detailed protocols aims to **streamline patient care** and **enhance interdepartmental collaboration** by presenting the communication mechanisms necessary for adequate mobilization. The key objectives of this plan are to:

Decongest the Emergency Department (ED)

- o Implement measures to reduce ED length of stay for patients
- o Eliminate or minimise barriers to optimal patient trajectories by establishing timely orientation decisions.
- o Expedite discharge or transfer patients from the ED to inpatient units.

Preserve Operating Room (OR) Functionality

 Ensure surgical schedules and emergency cases proceed without delays and minimise cancellations due to bed shortages.

Phases of the Overcapacity Plan

Phase 2: Early overcapacity measures (intercom announcement)

In patient unit actions:

- Transport and Housekeeping are briefed by the patient flow coordinator (or NRM)
- Priority will be attributed to facilitate either transport from the ED, ICU or PACU in the first **2 hours** then to patients awaiting tests for discharge (these are the patient identified as "potential")

Phase 3: Overcapacity

Transport manager:

- Plans additional manpower to reduce delays in discharging patients and internal movements
- Asks Urgence Santé to:
 - o move along people awaiting transport out of the MUHC
 - o review necessity of ambulance transport, if an alternative is possible
- Ask Assistant Nurse Manager to determine if the right kind of transport has been selected for the patient

Off Hours Protocol (before or after an Overcapacity Code)

- Patients awaiting transport can be moved to corridor
- Admitted patient can wait in the corridor while their room is being cleaned
- NRM to follow up with managers of Transport and Housekeeping on adjusting work force according to the needs to prioritize Overcapacity actions.
