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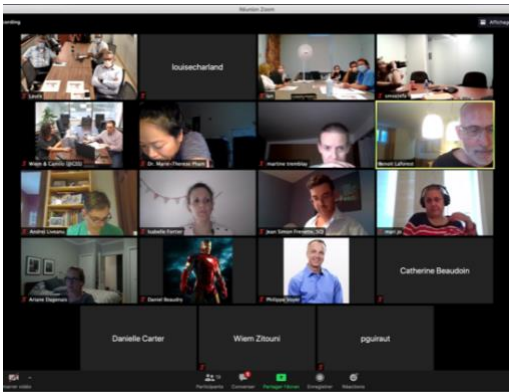

At this very important design stage, LEAN workshops are at the heart of the process. Physicians, specialists, managers, patient partners and AAPA experts were called upon to offer their views on the design details for the upcoming preliminary plan. Four workshops are planned for 2020, and two have already taken place:

- Lean Design workshop **Surgery, Endoscopy and URDM-E link**, July 7, 2020: 6th floor expansion and existing
- Lean Design workshop **Emergency, Day Surgery and Intensive care**, July 16, 2020: 1st floor extension



Also in progress, field drilling has begun to obtain soil samples.

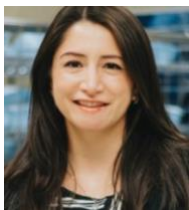
With the announcement of the provincial government’s investment in the modernization of the Lachine Hospital, the Foundation will be busier than ever in its efforts to reach the ambitious goal of **raising \$5 million in support of the project**. “The board of directors and Foundation staff continue work on their mandate to develop and launch this major fundraising campaign,” says Monica McDougall, Executive Director of the Foundation. “The first step was an awareness campaign with a new eye-catching logo to help bring the hospital into the public eye, and there will be a lot more to come in the months and years ahead. The community has been waiting for this new hospital for a very long time and the Foundation is proud to be an important partner in the process.”

Reporting to the Organizational Project Office, Claude’s other initiatives at the MUHC include the transition to the Glen Site (Cancer and Medicine Mission), as well as ambulatory dialysis and the transfer of 20 ventilated patients from the Montreal Chest Institute to the Camille-Lefebvre Pavilion in Lachine between 2009 and 2017. “My goal is to ensure that the needs of the clinical teams are heard and considered at every stage of the project. To do so, I focus my activities on the coordination of the multiple stakeholders involved, and I wish to support the clinical teams throughout the process.” Claude Lemieux is now located **in office 4B3** and is always happy to discuss the project with you!
