- Sedatives (Ex: Propofol, Precedex, Haldol)
- Anticoagulants (Ex: Heparin, Coumadin, Argatroban)
- Pressors (Ex: Levophed)
- Analgesics (Ex: Morphine, Fentanyl)
- **Role** Describe the role of your service in point form.

 - Initiating Functional Ax
 - Positioning
 - Treatment plan (acute/chronic/end stage)
 - Continuity of care (rehab/convalescence/homecare/community/LTC/palliative)
