

Start of Reconstruction Work on the Collector Sewer and Traffic Changes

Sir,
Madam,

Ville de Montréal wishes to inform you of the start of reconstruction work on a collector sewer 3.6 metres in diameter. This sewer will be located along Boulevard Décarie (eastern side), between the railway viaduct and Rue Saint-Jacques.

This work should begin the week of **December 6** and should continue until spring 2011.

Nature of the Work

Overall, this work consists of making a deep excavation along Boulevard Décarie, inserting the concrete structure that will serve as the collector sewer at the bottom of the excavation, connecting this sewer to the existing system and filling the excavation.

Traffic

Traffic will be disrupted on Boulevard Décarie, due to these major infrastructure reconstruction operations and the high truck traffic coming from the work site of the McGill University Health Centre (MUHC).

Here are the major changes to remember to ensure the safety of motorists:

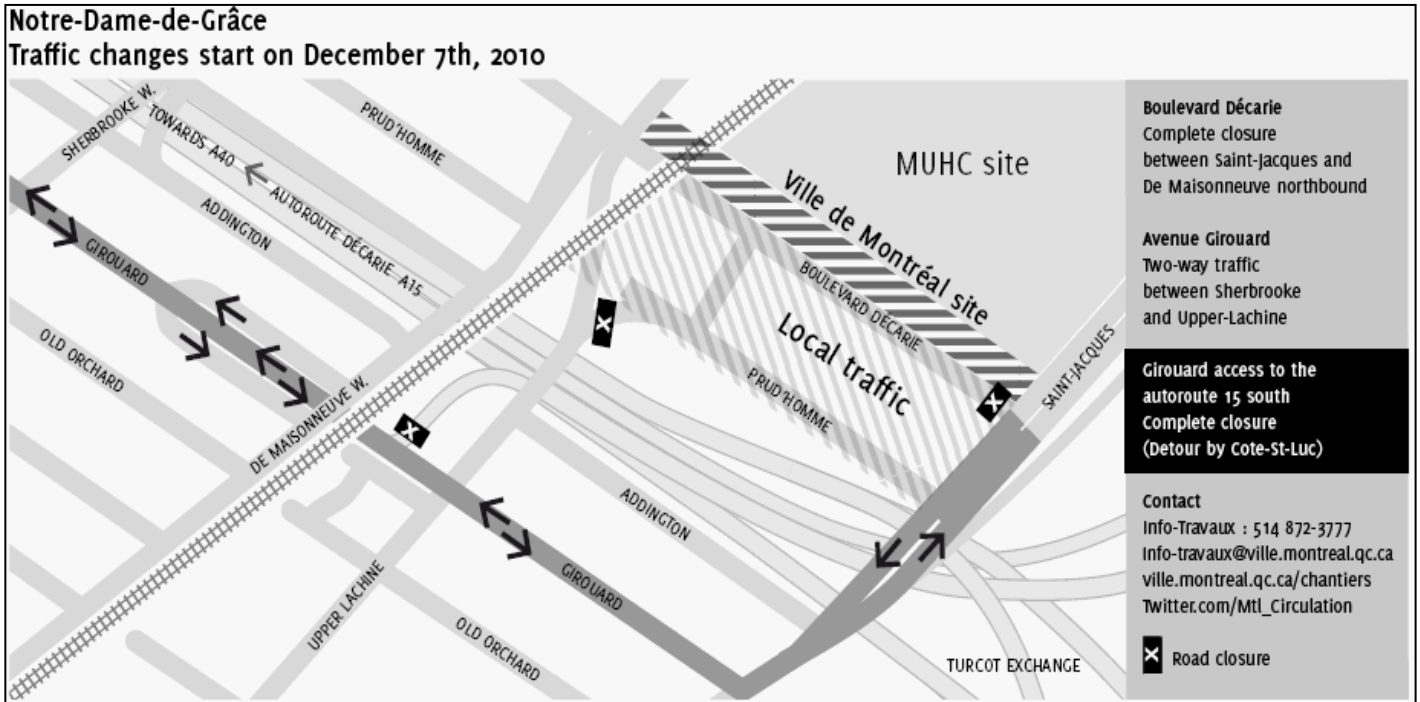
- **Northbound traffic on Boulevard Décarie, between Rue Saint-Jacques and Boulevard De Maisonneuve will be prohibited at all times from December 7.**
- **A detour will be available via Avenue Girouard which will be two-way between Rue Sherbrooke and Chemin Upper-Lachine.**
- **The entrance to Autoroute 15 South (Girouard) will be closed from December 7 indefinitely. Detour via the Côte-Saint-Luc entrance.**
