

## CALL FOR ELECTION CANDIDATES FOR THE NEXT MUHC CENTRAL USERS' COMMITTEE

WHAT IS THE MUHC CENTRAL USERS' COMMITTEE
<ul> <li>The MUHC Central Users' Committee (MUHC CUC) is the committee recognized and funded by the Ministry of Health and Social Services to:</li> <li>Inform users of their rights, namely 12 rights entrenched in the Act respecting health services and social services;</li> <li>Defend the collective rights and interests of users or, upon request, the rights and interests of an individual user, before the institution or any competent authority;</li> <li>Accompany and assist users, upon request, in any actions they undertake, including referring users to an Ombudsman and or assisting with the filing of a complaint with the Ombudsman;</li> <li>Ensure that the Camille-Lefebvre Residents' Committee (CHSLD) functions properly and has the necessary resources to carry out its duties; and:</li> <li>Moderate, organize and promote events, activities or projects designed to inform, assist or support users and encourage improvements in the quality and safety of services and of residents' living conditions.</li> </ul>
COMMITTEE COMPOSITION
The MUHC CUC has 10 members:         1 member per site and 2 members whose user experience involves at least three MUHC sites         • Montreal Children's Hospital (1)       • Montreal General Hospital (1)         • Royal Victoria Hospital (1)       • Lachine Hospital (1)         • Cedars Cancer Centre (1)       • Three MUHC sites (2)         • Montreal Chest Institute (1)       • Camille-Lefebvre Residence (1) (CHSLD)         • Montreal Neurological Hospital (1)
(CHSLD), who is appointed following a separate election.
<b>C</b> RITERIA TO STAND FOR ELECTION
<ul> <li>The candidate must be a current patient or recent former patient (used MUHC services in the last two years), or a legal representative of a patient or a recognized caregiver of a patient.</li> <li>In the case of the Montreal Children's Hospital, the candidate must be between the age of 13 and 18. A patient under the age of 13 cannot stand for election but may be represented as noted above by a legal representative and/or recognized caregiver.</li> <li>The candidate must not be an employee, supplier or service provider of the MUHC and/or of its research institute and/or any of its foundations.</li> <li>The candidate must not be under curatorship.</li> <li>The candidate cannot have a criminal record.</li> <li>The candidate cannot serve simultaneously on a local interest group (known before June 22 as site or mission users' committees) and should be prepared to step down if elected.</li> <li>For the 2022 election, the candidate must not have served on the MUHC CUC in the last three years.</li> </ul>
WHAT TO SUBMIT TO BE CONSIDERED AND BY WHAT DATE
Persons wanting to stand for election must send by e-mail the completed candidate application form and a letter of intent explaining why they believe they should be elected <b>by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, November 11, 2022.</b> The Election President will approve or reject applications based on the above-mentioned criteria in a reasonable timeframe, give or take one week.
